Guidelines for Authors

1) Structure

The manuscript should be compiled with the following separate sections:

1. Title Page
(Title of Paper, Full Name(s) of Author(s), Address, Telephone Number, Facsimile Number, Email Address, and Professional Affiliation)
2. Abstract (150 words) and Key Words (3–6 terms)
3. Main Text
4. Endnotes
5. References

2) Format

The paper should be in Microsoft Word or other text-file form. It should be double-spaced in a 12-point font, and not more than 5,000 words in length.

3) Sections and Subsections

Please follow the numbering style below, and not indent using Tab:

4) Mathematical Expressions and Formulae

Please use the percentage symbol “%” without a preceding space, not the word “percent.”

As a rule variables should be italicized:

x, y, z, X, Y, Z

5) Tables and Figures

Tables and Figures should be sent as black-and-white data-files (Excel, JPEG, PNG, etc.).

Please attach the respective numbers and titles (e.g.: “Figure 1: Ranking of GDP per Capita for 117 Countries”; and “Table 1: Degree of Dependence on Russia for Energy”).

6) Endnotes

Notes should be kept to a minimum, indicated in the main text by superscript figures to the right of the relevant term, phrase, or sentence (but following punctuation symbols) without a preceding space, and collected together at the end of the paper.

7) References

Within the main text any references quoted should be shown as follows: (Samuelson 1950). (Surname(s) of author(s) and year only.) Where there are four or more authors “et al” should be used: (Ishikawa et al 1993).

All citations within the text, including tables and graphs, should be included in the list of references.

References should be listed in alphabetical order.

The given names of authors should also be provided.

The list of references should also be double-spaced, and unnumbered.

For references that are in a language other than English, the Romanized version of the language/script should be used, followed by an English translation within square brackets.

For editorial purposes the inclusion, if possible, of the reference in the original script at the very end of the list of references, as in the example below, would be helpful. This will not appear in the final publication.
