Guidelines for Contributions

The Northeast Asian Economic Review is an ERINA English-language academic journal to be published twice annually, and we will accept a wide-range of contributions of peer-reviewed articles.

It includes studies on all aspects of economy and society in Northeast Asia (with the exception of studies focusing solely on Japan domestically), and research in areas related to ERINA's research activities is particularly welcome.

Submission Format and Length of Peer-Reviewed Articles

Please send peer-reviewed articles as email attachments or on a CD, in Microsoft Word or other text-file form. Papers should be double-spaced and not more than 5,000 words in length.

Summary, Keywords and JEL Classification Codes

All peer-reviewed articles must have a summary of not more than 150 words, with keywords (three to six terms), and JEL classification codes (up to three).

Title Page

The title page should contain the title of the paper, the full names and addresses of the authors, their contact information (telephone number, facsimile number and email address) and their professional affiliation. As the name of the author is to be withheld from the referees *the title of the paper only* should be repeated on the first page of the main text.

Guidelines for Authors

Please refer to the "Guidelines for Authors" regarding the other matters for the authors of articles we would like to be observed.

Proofreading of Articles

In principle this will be carried out once only using electronic media.

Pre-Submission Proofreading by a Native Speaker of English

Authors for whom English is a second language are recommended to have their papers checked by an English native speaker prior to submission.

The articles are received on the understanding that they are original contributions, and have not been published formally (in publications with ISBN and ISSN numbers), either in print or electronic form. This point must be stated clearly in the covering letter.

Refereeing

Once manuscripts have been anonymously peer-reviewed, their acceptance or rejection rests with the Editorial Board.

The anonymity of both authors and referees will be maintained throughout the reviewing process.

Copyright

The copyright of accepted peer-reviewed articles will belong to the author. Please refer to the “Guidelines on Copyright” regarding the copyright for accepted peer-reviewed articles.

Observance of the Guidelines for Contributions

We may decline to publish an article where there is a serious departure from the guidelines for contributions.
